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Flod

The pattern and colour of the hat is inspired by the changing water levels of the sea between ebb and flow, which results in the fine lines on the shore when the water recedes.

SIZES

S/M and L/XL

MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 49 (52) cm

Height: 17 (18) cm

Fits head sizes: 54-56 (56-60) cm

GAUGE

22 sts and 36 rows in pattern with 3.5 mm needles
= 10 x 10 cm.

Needle sizes are for guidance only.

If you have more sts per 10 cm, change to a larger needle. If you have fewer sts per 10 cm, change to smaller needles.

MATERIALS

Yarn from Filcolana

50 (50) g Saga colour 950 (Light Grey)

50 (50) g Alva colour 101 (Natural White)

The two yarns are held together throughout work.

Doublepointed needles 3.5 mm or

Circular needles 3.5 mm (80-100 cm) if you knit using magic loop technique.

1 stitch marker or contrast coloured yarn.



Technical

SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

German short rows

Knit to where the short row should be placed. Turn work and slip st onto right needle with yarn in front. Tug the yarn up and over the needle. This creates a double stitch. Continue working the row as instructed in pattern. On next row work the double sts together (German short rows are worked the same on both right sides and wrong sides).

Workflow

The hat is knit bottom up and with the 2 yarns held together.

First you knit the folded double ribbing edge and thereafter the pattern.

The hat is finished with decreases to give the rounded shape.



Pattern

RIBBING EDGE

With 3.5 mm and the 2 yarns held together cast on 104 (112) sts.

Continue knitting in the round and knit double ribbing (k2, p2) for 16 (18) cm, this will give the hat an 8-9 cm fold-up edge.

Fold the ribbing double so that the cast-on edge is on the inside (away from you) and knit the ribbing together as follows:

Insert left needle into the 1st of the cast-on edge, so that this st is placed before the 1st st on the needle, k2tog, repeat from * to * over all sts.

Knit 3 rounds.

Turn work inside out so that you knit the 'crown' of the hat from the wrong side. Start by knitting a German short row (see special techniques, remember to knit the double GSR sts together as you pass them) and knit as follows:

1st and 2nd round: Knit all sts.

3rd round: *k1, p1*, repeat from * to * over entire round.

Repeat these 3 rounds, until work measures approx. 11 (12) cm from beginning of pattern, finish with 3rd round.

Now decreases are made to give the rounded shape, knit as follows:

1st round: *k6, k2tog*, repeat from * to * over entire round = 91 (98) sts.

2nd round: Knit all sts.

3rd round: Follow pattern over all sts.

4th round: *k5, k2tog*, repeat from * to * over entire round = 78 (84) sts.

5th round: Knit all sts.

6th round: Follow pattern over all sts.

7th round: *k4, k2tog*, repeat from * to * over entire round = 65 (70) sts.

8th round: Knit all sts.

9th round: Follow pattern over all sts.

10th round: *k3, k2tog*, repeat from * to * over entire round = 52 (56) sts.

11th round: Knit all sts.

12th round: Follow pattern over all sts.

13th round: *k2, k2tog*, repeat from * to * over entire round = 39 (42) sts.

14th round: Knit next round.

15th round: K 1 (0), *k2tog*, repeat from * to *, to end = 20 (21) sts.

Break yarn and gently pull the strand through the remaining sts so the hole on the top is tightened.

FINISHING

Weave in all loose ends on wrong side of work.

Wash hat according to washing instructions on the label and lay flat to dry on a towel.
