# Pulsatilla - a beautiful crocheted baby blanket

Crocheting squares and then crocheting together the squares to form a blanket is a classic and fun discipline. Here little circles are framed by the squares in muted colours. Pulsatilla is crocheted in the softest of soft merino wool. Perfect for a baby blanket.

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## **Materials**

Anina from Filcolana

Color A: 50 g in 3 colours - see whihch below Color B: 50 g in 3 colours - see whihch below

+ 100 g for edges and joining squares

Crochet hook: 41/2 mm

#### Version in shades of red

<u>Color A</u>: 334 (Light Blush), 245 (Bordeaux) and 1850 (Purpur)

<u>Color B</u>: 954 (Light Grey melange), 955 (Medium Grey melange), 975 (Dark Chocolate melange) and 973 (Nougat melange)

For edges and joining squares: 973 (Nougat melange)

#### Version in shades of blue

Color A: 333 (Seafoam), 2169 (Blue Haze) and 1055 (Blue Violet)

<u>Color B</u>: 954 (Light Grey melange), 955 (Medium Grey melange), 975 (Dark Chocolate melange) and 973 (Nougat melange)

For edges and joining squares: 973 (Nougat melange)

#### **Finished measurements**

Approx. 80 x 100 cm - 9 X 12 squares.

#### Gauge

Each square should measure approx.  $9 \times 9 \text{ cm}$ .





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# **Abbrieviations**

ch: chain

dc: double crochet
htr: half treble
sl st: slip stitch
st: stitch
tr: treble

#### **Notes**

Crochet around the tails, so you don't have to darn in all of them in the end. The pattern uses UK crochet terms

### **Square**

Follow the chart or use the method described here.  $\operatorname{Ch}$  4.

**Round 1 (color A):** Make 16 tr in the 4. ch from the hook, 1 sl st in the first tr to join the round.

**Round 2 (color A):** Ch 3 (does not count as a tr), 2 tr in each st, using color B make 1 sl st in the first tr to join the round = 32 tr.

**Round 3 (color B):** Ch 1, \*1 dc in first 3 st, 1 htr in next st, 1 tr in next st, [2 tr, ch 2 (corner), 2 tr] in next st, 1 tr in next st, 1 htr in next st\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, 1 sl st in the first dc to join the round. **Round 4 (color B):** Ch 3, 1 tr in each st – [2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr] in each corner ch space, 1 sl st in the first tr to join the round. Fasten off.

Make 108 squares in different color combinations. Joining the squares: Place the squares the way you prefer in 12 rows of each 9 squares.

Join the squares in strips first in one direction and afterwards in the other direction in the following way: Place two squares right sides facing. Join yarn with a sl st in the corner of the first square, make 1 dc in the same corner, make 1 dc in the corner of the second square. Skip 1 st on the first square and make 1 dc in next st, skip 1 st on the second square and make 1 dc in next st. Continue this way crocheting 1 dc alternately in the first and second square each time skipping a st. Continue until all squares of the first strip are joined.

# Edge (in colour 973)


Crochet 1 round of tr around the blanket – 1 tr in each st, 1 tr in each corner of a square and 1 tr in each join, in the corners of the blanket make [2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr].

Make 2 rounds of dc – [1 dc, ch 2, 1 dc] in each blanket corner and 1 dc in each st.

### **Embroidery**

Sew 8 straight stitches from the centre of the square around the first round on some of the squares.

Weave in yarn ends. Wash blanket gently and let it dry flat.
