Chrysanthemum - a lovely shawl

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The inspiration for this multi directional design is the colors of the yarn. This is your chance to play with colors and find the combination that suits you - or to knit a shawl that looks just like the one in the photos.

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Materials

Color A: 200 g Anina by Filcolana in color 334 (Light Blush) Color B: 100 g Anina by Filcolana in color 514 (Dry Woods) Circular needle 3,5 mm, 60 cm long

Size

One size

Measurements

1st part: Wingspan 114 cm, Height 77 cm 2nd part: Wingspan 77 cm, Height 77 cm

Gauge

21 sts and 42 rows in garter stitch in 3,5 mm needles = 10×10 cm.

Special abbreviations

<u>Skp (decrease)</u>: Slip 1 stitch, knit the next stitch, pass the slipped stitch over the knit one. <u>Sl1</u>: Slip 1 stitch purl-wise with the yarn held in back

Directions for knitting

The 1st part of the shawl begins at one tip and is worked back and forth in alternating (vertical) garter stripes of the solid and the multicolored yarn. The 2nd part is worked back and forth in the opposite (horizontal) direction, and the stitches for part one is joined with the stitches for part two along the way.





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Chrysanthemum

Shawl 1st part:

Cast on 3 sts with color A. Work the following pattern: Row 1 (WS): Sl1, knit to end of row, cast on 5 new stitches using the backward loop method, turn. Row 2: K6, pass the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th stitch over the 6th, yarn over, knit to end of row. Row 3: Sl1, knit to end of row. Change to color B. Row 4: Knit to end of row. Row 5: Sl1, knit to end of row. Change to color A. Row 6: K1, yarn over, knit to end of row. Repeat these 6 rows until you have worked a total og 80 stripes in color B. End on Row 3. There are now 163 sts on the needle.

2nd part:

Now it's time to work in the opposite direction. Change to color B. Row 1: K1, yarn over, skp, turn. Row 2: Sl1, knit to end of row. Change to color A. Row 3: K1, yarn over, k1, skp, turn. Row 4: Sl1, knit to end of row, cast on 5 new stitches using the backward loop method, turn. Row 5: K6, pass the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th stitch over the 6th, yarn over, k2, skp, turn. Row 6: Sl1, knit to end of row.

Continue in this way, knitting the a stitch from the 1st part together with one from the 2nd part at the end of each RS row until there are no more sts from the 1st part left.

Bind off:K2, *insert the left needle through these 2 sts and knit them together, $k2^*$. Repeat from * to * until all the sts have been bound off.

Special technique: Backward loop cast-on Cast on new stitches by forming a backward loop around the needle.



Finishing

Weave in the ends. Rinse the work, put it through a (dry) spin cycle and lay it on a flat surface to dry.





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
