Mathildes blomsterklæde

A colourful and flowering scarf crocheted i the softest yarn.

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Materials

Indiecita from Filcolana: 50 g of each of the following colours:

225 (Christmas Red)

237 (Autumn Orange)

231 (Delphinium Blue)

228 (Smoke Blue)

234 (Lime Juice)

221 (Thyme)

Crochet hook 3 mm

Measurements

15 x 120 cm

Abbrieviations

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

sc = single crochet

sl st = slip stitch

tr = treble

Pattern notes

The scarf is made from small two-coloured flowers with six petals. You can crochet them together as you go or sew them together at last. The pattern uses US terms.





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Flower

Chain 2 using colour 1.

Round 1: 12 sc in the 2th ch from the hook. Join round with 1 sl st in the 1st ch.

Round 2: Crochet in the back loop only: 1 sl st in 1st sc. In the same sc make: ch 3, * 1 tr. 1 tr in next sc. In next sc: 1 tr, ch 3, 1 sl st, ch 3, 1 tr*. Repeat from * to * 4 times more. 1 tr in next st. Complete round with 1 tr, ch 3, 1 sl st in last sc (6 petals).

Round 3: Crochet in the front loop from round 1 using colour 2. Join yarn with a 1 sl st in 2nd sc (the same st as the tr on round 2), *ch 2, 2 dc, ch 2, 1 sl st in the same st. Skip 1 sc, 1 sl st in next st*. Repeat from * to * 5 times more. Join with 1 sl st in the beginning sl st.

Finishing

If you wish to crochet the flowers together as you go, you will do this on round 2 by making 1 sl st in the middle treble on the adjecent flower. Otherwise you finish all flowers and sew them together petal to petal.

Make 91 flowers in different colours.

Place the flowers in rows of 3 and 4 flowers alternatingly. The second to last row at each end of the scarf should have 3 flowers and the last row only 2 flowers (as shown in the chart).

Weave in all loose ends and press every flower using steam.

Placement of flowers at each end of the scarf:
