Mie - a soft garter stitch shawl

The shawl is knit in the softest merino wool, using only knit stitches and short rows, which shape the little flouncy edge.

Materials

Anina by Filcolana 100 g in color 516, 100 g in color 1061 and 50 g in color 243 4 mm circular needle, 60 cm long 4 mm crochet hook 1 stitchmarker

Measurements

Length: 160 cm Width (at the widest point): 43 cm

Gauge

22 sts and 44 rows in garter stitch on a 4 mm needle = 10×10 cm.

Abbreviations

M1: Make 1 st by lifting the chain between stitches onto the left needle and knitting it through the back loop.

Color changes

To get a neat edge at the upper edge of the shawl (with no crocheted edge), make sure to cross the yarns in the same way every time you change color.

Shawl

Knit all rows (working back and forth on a circular needle).

Cast on 16 sts in color 516 using a 4 mm circular needle.

Row 1: K2, place a marker, k14.

Row 2: K10, turn.





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Row 3: K10, turn. Row 4: K16. Row 5 (in color 1061): K2, M1 before the marker, k14. Row 6: K10, turn. Row 7: K10, turn. Row 8: K17. Row 9 (in color 516): K17. Row 10: K10, turn. Row 11: K10, turn. Row 12: K17. Row 13 (in color 1061): K3, M1 before the marker, k14. Row 14: K10, turn. Row 15: K10, turn. Row 16: K18. Repeat Row 9 - 16, with an increase every 13th and thus one more stitch before the marker. When a total of 75 increases have been worked (= 91 sts on the needle, ending on Row 16), work Row 9 -12, and then again Row 9 - 12 using color 243, then using color 516 and again using color 1061. Work decreases now, where an increase was worked previously: Row 1 (in color 516): Knit to 2 sts before the marker, k2tog, k14. Row 2: K10, turn. Row 3: K10, turn. Row 4: Knit to end of row. Row 5 (in color 1061): Knit to end of row. Row 6: K10, turn. Row 7: K10, turn. Row 8: Knit to end of row. Repeat Row 1 - 8 until there are 17 sts left on the needle. Work Row 1 - 3. Bind off.

Finishing

Crochet an edge along the flounces using color 243 and working a double crochet (UK term) for each garter ridge.

Weave in the ends. Rinse the shawl, put it through a (dry) spin cycle and lay it on a flat surface to dry.
